This activity is all about creating your own Fleetwood Weather Report

If you want to watch the weather, head up to the Mount Pavilion for the best view on the Fylde Coast! Not only can you see across Fleetwood but the Lake District & Morecambe Bay too. Don't worry if you can't make it up there you can weather watch from anywhere



Did you know???

The Mount Pavilion collected Meteorological readings of the weather from 8th September 1886 up until 1933



Here's how to make your Weather Report:

Take some sheets of A4 paper and fold them in half to make the pages of your journal. You can use a mixture of different thicknesses & colours of paper

Next push a pencil through the top left hand corner of all your pieces of paper, then tread some string, ribbon or wool through and tie to secure your pages

Now you can start to fill your report with lots of creative data about the weather you see:

- Drawings
- Paintings
- A collage of the weather
- Write a poem or story about the weather
- Write a description of the weather
- Photograph the weather; sky, clouds, puddles, trees blowing, shadows created by the sun, people wrapped up in hats & scarves etc.



You can observe the weather wherever you are so try moving around the town

- The Mount Pavilion
- The beach
- Through your window at home
- Your garden
- School
- On a walk
