### 1: Introduction

1.1 Results of	The results of consultation are an essential component of the evidence base for the Green Infrastructure Strategy.
Consultation	A thorough consultation exercise was held between May and August 2013 to develop the Green Infrastructure Strategy and this document details key particular:
	- Consultation Workshops
	Two Consultation Workshops were undertaken on the 18 <sup>th</sup> and 19 <sup>th</sup> June 2013 with stakeholder organisations and local authority officers. The workshops pro local knowledge and priorities. There was a remarkable degree of agreement between Stakeholders and Local Authority Officers.
	- Public Survey – Wyre Great Outdoors
	Community Consultation was also undertaken in the form of the Wyre Great Outdoors Survey. Questionnaires were made available for a month on the paper copies made available at public information points e.g. libraries and the Wyre Estuary Country Park at Stanah. Two editions of the Wyre Great available. The first was targeted at adults and the second at children and young people. Copies of the Outdoor Survey sheets are included in this report.
	- Collection of information on projects and programmes
	A questionnaire was used to gather information to be fed into the Implementation Framework. A copy of the questionnaire forms part of this appendix.
1.2 Factual Record	This appendix is a factual record of the results of the consultation exercises.
	The results have directly informed the Green Infrastructure Strategy making into a credible and robust strategy.
1.3 Consultation Workshops	The workshops were held at Wyre Civic Centre, Poulton-le-Fylde on the 18 <sup>th</sup> and 19 <sup>th</sup> June 2013. Attendees had been invited by Wyre Council Planning Dep group consisted of approximately 4 – 8 persons with a facilitator coordinating and guiding discussion.
	Both workshops lasted for three hours. The first workshop was targeted at Stakeholders and the second at local authority personnel and members.
	The key findings and annotated maps arising from each workshop is attached.
1.4 Great Outdoors	The Great Outdoors survey was a carefully constructed and delivered public consultation over a 6 week period.
Survey	Online questionnaires were issued on the Wyre Council website and paper copies made available at public information outlets including public libraries and Park Visitor Centre.
	The results of the Great Outdoors survey have been complied into a series of pie-charts and analysed. The results have been fed into the Green Infrastructu those responses that were operational and not strategic have been fed into the action planning process.
1.5 Collection of information on projects and programmes	The questionnaire was distributed to key actors in Wyre Council and delivery partners. The key objective beings to collect information to feed into the Wyre Strategy Implementation Framework. Strategic responses are included in the Framework and operational ones carried forward into Action Planning. #### TO CONCLUDE, are there any other comments you would like to bring to the Council's attention regarding Wyre's great outdoors?

- 1. Please make the most of the opportunities to work with both public and private sector land owners to help the manage the great outdoors for a wide range of sustainable benefits from biodiversity to good public health and local economy
- 2. Make attractive gardens and a play area on the park area near the allotments on Sandringham Ave, Thornton
- 3. advertise more not just Wyre but Fleetwood town council and other parish councils and LCC could do more promoting the area
- 4. Wyre do a good job all in all but I fear that the green belt is being eaten away that divides Blackpool to Wyre and Wyre to Fylde. I would like to see more facilities for grass games such as rounders without people moaning that the kids (or even adults) are on the grass playing. I would like to see more 'events' in the parks like little concerts on a Sunday afternoon maybe once a month - Jean Stansfield Park would be ideal for this now the paths have been widened.
- 5. Improvements are desperately need to the path from the Yacht club in the area next the Boat docking areas (Scrap yard). When the rubbish dump at Fleetwood is finally closed, could the path from the back of ICI be extended from along the river west side to come out near the Fleetwood docks.
- 6. Pity you weren't thinking like this when WBC was prepared to allow building a Health Centre on Vicarage Park !! What a farce and waste of public money
- 7. Generally we are fortunate in Wyre with our diverse environment. And its quality. Let's aim to keep it that way. Once under concrete it's gone for ever!
- 8. I think that in general Wyre Council does a great job in managing its coast and countryside. I would like to be involved at some time in the future but my time is at a premium at the moment so cannot at present. I think sites 1 and 2 that I have mentioned earlier are areat accessible facilities but would like to see more paths and large trees a d some wild meadows.
- 9. PLEASE don't build any more housing developments on Hardhorn Road
- 10. ensure Wyre people ie Thornton and Cleveleys are aware of the full area of the council borough ie remind them of Garstang / Bowland etc and surrounding area etc
- 11. Please stop selling off any bit of green space to building developers. Thornton used to be semi-rural, with a sense of community, not an estate developers dream with some very recent, barren looking, soulless estates (near the old ICI road near Burn Naze) With the ever-increasing traffic and inadequate road system .it's going to be harder and harder to get out of some parts of Wyre to enjoy the countryside beyond
- 12. I think we are very lucky to live with both the coast and countryside accessible and that the Council does a good job maintaining all open spaces
- 13. ITS THE YEAR OF OPEN SPACE AND GREEN AREAS FOR THE YOUNG ONCE THESE SPACES ARE BUILT ON THEY ARE LOST FOREVER I HAVE LIVED IN THORNTON ALL MY LIFE AND AND WATCHED GREEN SPACE. DISSAPEAR
- 14. Would like some areas in parks where dogs are allowed to run off a lead.

- 15. stop bodging road repairs and do a proper repair. Stop wasting money planting saplings and plant more mature tress which will have a better chance of maturing. Return the litter bins that were taken away, stop wasting money on dog control orders and give people the chance to use common sense
- 16. It is scandalous that Outline Planning Permission has been approved to sell a major part of King Georges Playing Field for possible future building of 64 units. This is the last large open space near the centre of Thornton. It was given to the residents of Thornton for the benefit of us all. It should be improved and saved for the benefit for use, our children and grandchildren.
- 17. Actively ban horses from Tithe barn park. They are coming down the winding path, leaving horse manure on paths (noted 08/06/13) and leaving hoof holes (noted 06/06/13) in the grass, all where children play. They appear to come on early morning / late at night when no one around.
- 18. I don't think people of Wyre realise what a fantastic coastline we have and its all just on our doorstep
- 19. Just keep doing what your doing, all Children and Adults enjoy being able to walk or cycle to a place to relax and when its all clean and tidy, you can't ask for more!
- 20. I feel very lucky to live inn the Wyre borough, with such lovely natural country/seaside.
- 21. Particularly in Stanley Park, we need more staff to watch over the place. It's a wonderful asset and needs to be protected and cared for.
- 22. There is one very important question that is missing from this survey that applies to all current or proposed future sites and that is PRESERVATION and PROTECTION in PERPETUITY for all our parks and open spaces. Failure to do so will be a disaster for both today's and future generations. Jubilee Gardens is a perfect example of how a poorly planned development has totally ruined a memorial park and wasted public funds. These wasted resources could have not only have enhanced Jubilee Gardens but other areas as well.
- 23. In "open" spaces you do your best to cram them full of trees and play facilities which leaves them not "open" at all! In woodlands, where one might expect to find a lot of trees you spend time cutting them down. Site 2 above, Towers Woods has been totally ruined by the latest "improvements". No doubt you will be planning another child activity centre. The cost this council spends on child activity centres, je like the one at Stanah is scandalous. Why should a so called natural country park have to have a child activity centre?
- 24. The three aigantic wind turbines outside my home are horrendous. They are alien eyesores from as far away as Lancaster and throughout the Fylde. We are now threatened with further turbines on Rawcliffe Moss. The public is massively opposed to them. The area is functionally linked to the Morecambe Bay SPA, being the direct flight route and foraging ground of geese and swans protected under international law. No amount of 'mitigation' can compensate for the damage they will cause. If the local authority has any regard for our countryside, these monsters must not be allowed to destroy it for ever.
- 25. Yes its not great, but it might be one day if the Council start's representing rather than controlling.
- 26. My personal feeling is that you need to go to Garstang for instance to really see/enjoy a "Green space" and as I live nearer to Blackpool that is a long trek. More areen spaces between would be good for us all. I really would like to know just "what" green spaces within the borough are there for us all to use and how they can be enjoyed.
- 27. Although I do not live in Wyre, my job does take me to the coast regularly and I enjoy Wyre's countryside recreationally. Over-Wyre is areat for bird watching (particularly winter). Wyre has a good varied countryside from coast to fells with something for everyone. Please keep wildlife conservation at the core of the Coast and Countryside Ranger's activities. The rangers (both employed and volunteers) do a great job not only caring for the countryside but also for showing people how great it is. I can't begin to write down all the wonderful things I've learnt from Len Blacow over the years! I passionately believe quality areenspaces are vial to improved well-being and I'm pleased there are several Green Flag sites in Wyre.
- 28. We should be focussing on being a healthy alternative to Blackpool, if marketed right Fleetwood and Cleveleys and in between could offer more affluent visitors a chance to buy great fresh fish, cycle on the prom and enjoy some quality lunches in Poulton (the other day out at the seaside...). Craft fairs, farmers markets etc... these are an attractive package to sell to visitors (and residents) seeking a healthy more classy day out
- 29. there is a lack of wild flower open meadow spaces, we have established grass areas which are cut and kept tidy which look ok . Sowing wild flower meadows are more colourful, attract wild life provide a food source for bees and cost less to maintain, why not have some joined up thinking with LCC regarding round about and road side verges planting wild flower greas similar to the open spaces when travelling thro Clitheroe on the A59. In Wyre we don't have a single wild flower area around Thornton Cleveleys Poulton and Fleetwood, why ???? try it be brave.....
- 30. More off road cycle schemes needed, using the old Poulton to Fleetwood railway line as a commuter route.
- 31. Take greater steps to control dogs that foul public areas. Fine the owners a  $\hat{A}_{\pm}1,000$  for each offence
- 32. Wyre Council regularly advocates a determination to provide additional 'areen' space, whilst reducing the current 'green' space. An area of Jubilee Gardens in Cleveleys has been taken to provide coach and car parking facilities! We were told that coaches would be banned from parking on the promenade in the Anchorsholme area, and suitable facilities would be provided for a 'drop off' and 'pick up' point in Cleveleys town centre. Coaches would then be driven to suitable parking and driver facilities, adjacent to the Thornton re-cycling operation. At the same time, plans were being made to provide coach parking facilities on Jubilee Gardens! Green space, including a neglected bowling areen and a large area of the sports field adjacent to the Leisure Centre, will be lost in Thornton if current plans for housing development is allowed to proceed!
- 33. I would like to see an increase in the use of renewable technology in the area of public outdoor space but without detracting from the special features that an area would have, for example the small wind turbines on Cleveleys Sea front that are an attractive feature to the area.
- 34. the last two auestions are irrelevant to this survey
- 35. Wyre does not own enough public open space provision for allotments, areas for large canopied trees severely restricted.
- 36. Yo it are doing a great job.
- 37. The Copse Road, Fleetwood, bridleway is only signed for cyclists and walkers. Please will you sign it correctly for horse riders.
- 38. In this vicinity (Cleveleys) there are a lack of flowers in Jubilee Gardens and the main shopping area. What planting there is looks careless and slapdash. Desecration of local parks and open spaces should not be allowed under any circumstances and should be given the protection they deserve.
- 39. The area is generally short of access to safe area for riding, walking, cycling. When we go further inland to areas where one would expect limited access to safe areas there is often surprising numbers of trails and tracks usable for leisure activities. Even areas where it is possible to ride locally there are difficulties accessing parking due to barriers across enhances, e.g. Near the Stork at Glasson
- 40. What has been achieved so far is impressive, but efforts need to be made to encourage more cycle use, walkers, etc by providing proper cycle routes which are safe.
- 41. Play parks for young children (under 6) seem to be lacking, but I know you have funding at Wyre Estuary for one which is fantastic. Also is there any requirement for any disabled facilities at parks? Adapted swings etc. Not sure of the disability ratio in Wyre. But overall you do a fantastic job, keep up the good work.
- 42. I think Wyre does an excellent job in ensuring that our countryside is well maintained.
- 43. Wyre manages it's green spaces very well. In particular it's volunteering programmes and engagement with schools are excellent. But we do need more allotments!

- 44. My nearest park of note is Stanley park and then the nearest size wise is Preston or Lancaster. Would be nice to have more large parks with sports facilities, walks and play areas.
- 45. There are still insufficient places for horse riders to access. Perimeters of playing fields could be used safely and funding should be made available for this.
- 46. I want to encourage my kids, our future generation, to enjoy the countryside and natural environment. I want to see a varied mix of landscapes like Wyre uniquely offers such as Moors, Mosses and Wetlands to be enhanced. I want landscapes to be protected. I want landscapes to be accessible in terms of obvious paths, signage, parking and facilities such as toilets, seats, picnic benches and litter bins. I am concerned about the potential negative impacts of the emerging fracking industry on the local landscapes. If brought forward the council must agree with the industry to support the local area by investing in new green infrastructure such as outdoor play equipment, pitches and also in natural habitats and nature trails - people need to see real investment and benefit from the industry given the adverse impacts it will cause.
- 47. There should be places to walk your doas so they can play, but children aren't allowed so you don't have to worry about your doa.
- 48. Wyre has a tremendous asset in our great outdoors and it needs looking after--in order to maximise benefits for health and wellbeing (which saves money for NHS in the long term, it will encourage biodiversity, and help prevent /control flooding. In addition there is tremendous economic potential from the variety of attractive sites for visitors. The birdwatching potential could be a great economic plus.
- 49. It would be great to have cycle routes that could be used for commuting. The route from Thornton to Poulton is too busy for cycling on a regular basis.
- 50. We appreciate houses have to be built however the Council should make developers build on brown field sites FIRST such as the ex ICI area. We hope that more roads in the Thornton area soon come 20 mph zones with enforcement. Rossendale Avenue is a 20 mph zone yet idiots continue to break the speed limits. Hawthorne Road is used as a stretch to see just how fast they can go.
- 51. As technology has an ever increasing effect on all our lives, I feel it should be top priority that we encourage our children to get outside, experience nature and play outdoors. All play areas should be encouraged, however large or small. Every family should have a play facility within a 10 minute walk! Once children are outdoors they develop a natural interest in their surroundings which long term, I hope, will lead to them valuing and helping to maintain our natural begutiful countryside.
- 52. For too long Wyre Council has undervalued its green spaces. It has often been guite prepared to sacrifice its open space in the name of development. The green infrastructure needs to be given a much higher priority status and thereby conserved and enhanced.
- 53. As we have a large elderly presence in Thornton we really do need more places for them to just sit 'have a rest and enjoy the fresh air. Perhaps somewhere between the library the doctors on Church Road off the main road would be a good place.
- 54. Existing open pace in Thornton, and the other urban areas of Wyre, must be protected and improved. Public open space should NOT be sold off for building. The Council's own policies should be reinforced and followed and not ignored. A joined up approach is desperately needed.
- 55. Does thought need to be given to areas of open green space available for community use and for children to run around and play. Using Garstang as an example, most of the open grassed area near the old council offices has been fenced off. Development at Keeple Lane has also been proposed, which in itself is a positive but this may be to the detriment of open grassed areas available for children.
- 56. Get the railway from Poulton to Fleetwood started (and completed) a.s.a.p. This has been ongoing for so long and procrastination seems to predominate. Come on Wyre......Speeds things up considerably.
- 57. Definite shortage of cycle trails where facilities exist. Railway line through Thornton, Hambleton to Knott-End Skippool to Freeport via River Bank
- 58. Mental health walking essential in natural areas. Have to rely on a bus a lot. No. 87 Poulton Stanah I use a lot which is good. Bus to beaches would very useful.
- 59. To much of the great outdoors is unkempt and poorly looked after i.e. Hazlehurst, Grizedale, Parlick in Garstang, Poor road, poor verges
- 60. Lack of safe cycling routes. I used to cycle more than 1000 km a year but stopped because of dangers, i.e. too close to traffic which often seemed oblivious to cyclists, potholes and poor quality roads caused punctures and accidents.
- 61. I would like better maintenance and running of Fleetwood paddling pool Council to sort out the mess that is Fleetwood Outdoor pool!!
- 62. Start prosecuting dog owners who do not clean up after their dog and also those who do but leave the bag for someone else to clean up
- 63. Do something with outside pool at baths. Even if you grass it over and grow wildflowers
- 64. Is there as much co-ordination between Councils (Wyre, LCC etc). Environment Agency, UU etc and with organisations as there could be.
- 65. I think we are very lucky in Wyre with the facilities we have. The Wyre rangers and volunteers do a fantastic job.
- 66. We do not need more 'facilities' in open spaces (other than parks and sports grounds), we just need better access
- 67. The coast is particularly littered. P always pick up at least 3 bags every trip, there are plenty of bins, some people don't use them!!! Generally everywhere is lovely very well done.

I know a lot of work has been done, but there are some areas of Cleveleys with very little in the way of green spaces. Many people have taken up their gardens, thus squeezing out places for wild life to go to.
- 70. We need much better access for mountain biking and off road cycling in the area
- 71. Be economical with public money. Other organisations will monitor and support wildlife, and encourage healthy life styles. Most notices are a waste of time and money. People will find what they want don't charge them for superfluous Council actions.

- 73. I feel very strongly that the half built evesore apartment block beside Bourne End Pub should be torn down it should never have been given planning permission! It's been derelict for more years that I can remember - an utter eyesore on a beautiful shoreline - needs to be a small garden/picnic area with plastic tables benches and young children's play equipment. This would greatly enhance this area of Knott End, bring in more business to cafes/pubs/shops/transforming the shoreline from what has become a standing joke and a total blot on the landscape at present. Furthermore, it is a dreadful "first impression" to trippers taking the ferry across from Fleetwood!!
- 74. Most things are family good the Marine Garden's at Fleetwood. I think I have been spoilt there is no colour and the grass area's are not as good
- 75. Duncan, volunteers and bee keepers at the Wyre Country Park are fantastic! Helpful, friendly and have made our days out at the Wyre a very positive experience.
- 76. Stop Building on Greenbelt land!!!


