To agree a consultation process to introduce a Public Space Protection Order (PSPO) to prevent members of the public from feeding seagulls

On 13 July 2017 the Corporate Director Health and Wellbeing submitted a report seeking the Health and Community Engagement Portfolio Holder's approval to approve a consultation process, relating to the introduction of a new PSPO to prevent members of the public feeding seagulls in identified areas.

Decision taken

The Health and Community Engagement Portfolio Holder agreed that a consultation process be undertaken to consult on a potential new offence to be included on a PSPO, preventing members of the public from feeding seagulls in identified areas.
