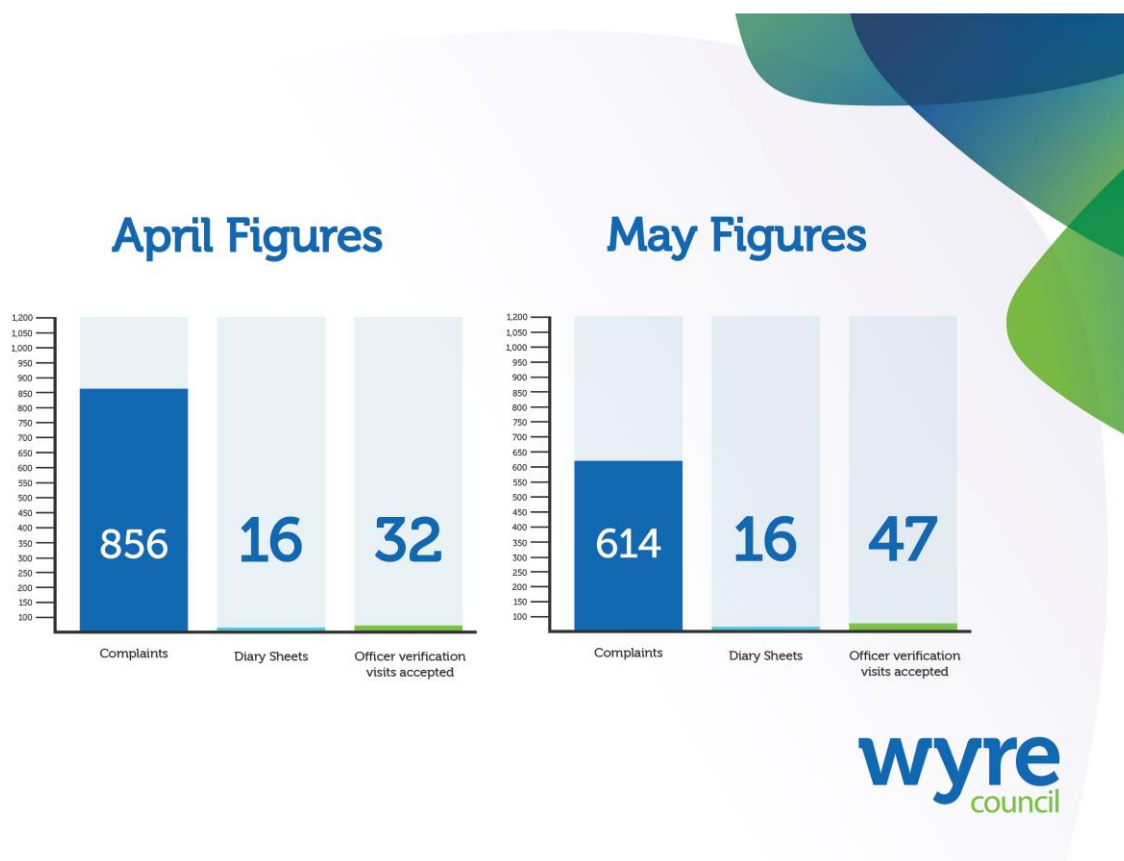


May 2026 Community Update: Jameson Road Landfill site

We are committed to keeping residents updated on the action being taken to address odour issues at the Jameson Road Landfill site. We understand the effect these odours can have on daily life, both inside homes and in outdoor spaces, and we are continuing to work towards a long-term solution.

Figures for May:



- In May we received and assessed 614 complaints related to unwanted odour from the site.
- In total, we received 16 completed Odour Diary Sheets. Two were from businesses and 14 from four households.
- A total of 47 verification visits were undertaken by council officers in April. Of these, six visits were made to homes. The remainder included businesses, schools and nurseries in the area.

What else are we doing?

- Wyre Council issued an abatement notice to Transwaste Recycling and Aggregates Ltd on 30th April. It legally requires the company to stop unwanted odour from impacting residents in their homes and workplaces within 60 days, and to prevent it from happening again. This timeframe follows legal advice and reflects the legislation's requirement to allow the operator a reasonable period to comply.
- Transwaste has appealed the abatement notice. The council is now preparing the evidence it has gathered, including information from residents, businesses and officer verification visits, to present to the court. This evidence demonstrates the impact of unwanted odour on local people in their homes and places of work.
- **Residents affected by unwanted odour should continue to complete diary sheets and report incidents to the Council.** Now the abatement notice is in force, this evidence is vital to help the council monitor compliance and take further action if needed.
- We met with the Environment Agency in relation to a variation of permit notice it issued to Transwaste this month. This notice specifies that the site can only accept inert waste going forward. This type of waste is less likely to cause unwanted odour.

We need your help

An abatement notice has been issued to Transwaste but it remains important that residents continue to report incidents of unwanted odour. This is so the Council can monitor the situation and take further action if needed.

We can only do this with your help...

Please follow these three steps to make your experience count in this investigation:

1. Complete Odour Diary Sheets

You should include:

- when and how long you were impacted
- where in your home you smelt the odour
- how strong it was and how it affected you

Continue recording this information as long as you are affected and submit the completed sheets regularly - every 7 or 14 days.

On days when there is no odour, please write this down too.

2. Send completed sheets back to Wyre Council

3. Accept an officer verification visit

These are essential if we are to take a strong case forward for statutory nuisance.

Ideally, these visits should take place in the part of your home where you are most affected and which your diary evidence covers. However, if accessing your home is not convenient, we can sometimes conduct the visit in your garden or another suitable outdoor area.
