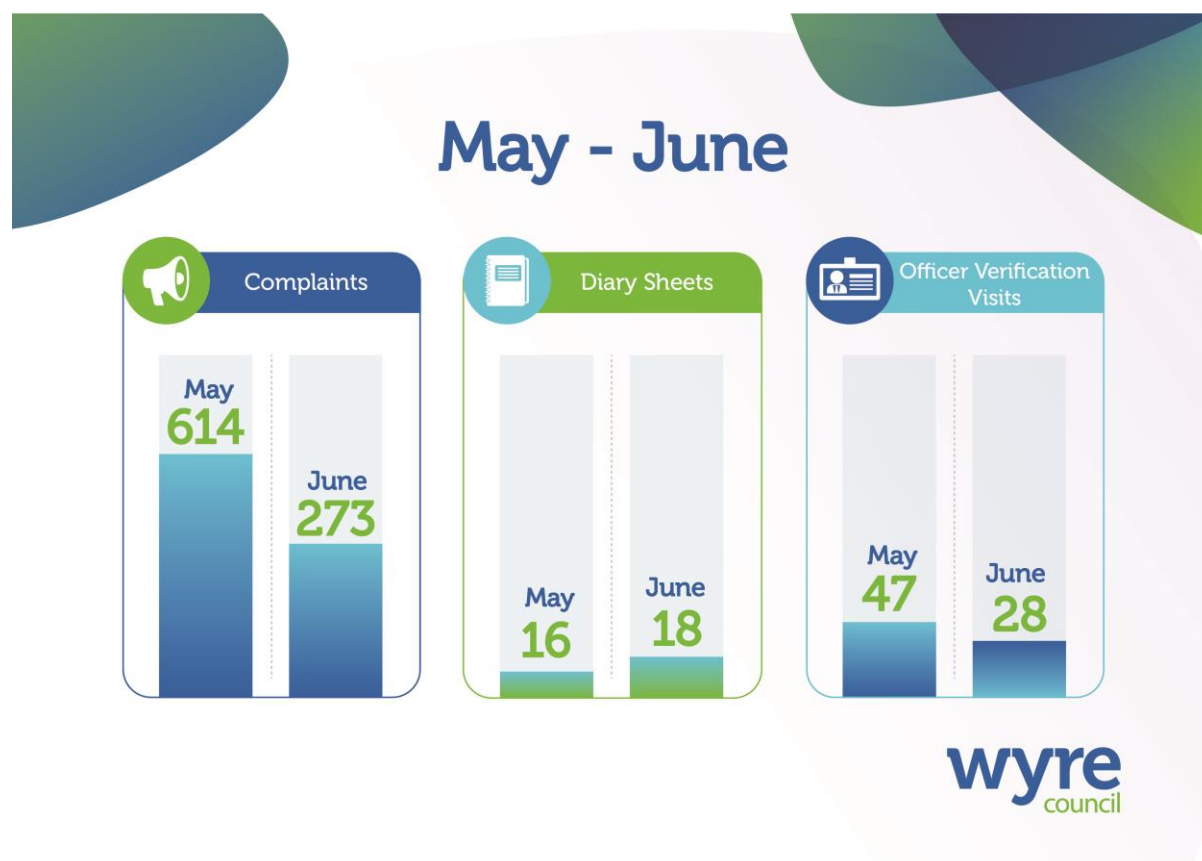


June 2026 Community Update: Jameson Road Landfill site

We are committed to keeping residents updated on the action being taken to address odour issues at the Jameson Road Landfill site. We understand the effect these odours can have on daily life, both inside homes and in outdoor spaces, and we are continuing to work towards a long-term solution.

Figures for June:



- In June we received and assessed 273 complaints related to unwanted odour from the site.
- In total, we received 18 completed Odour Diary Sheets. Of these, 17 were sent in by four households and one was submitted by a commercial premises.
- Council officers carried out 28 verification visits in June, including visits to two homes. The remaining visits were to businesses and other locations.

What else are we doing?

- We have continued to encourage residents to record incidents of unwanted odour on diary sheets after the council issued an abatement notice to Transwaste on 30th April. Diary sheets are a vital part of how we monitor compliance with this notice.
- Our officers completed odour verification visits to two properties as part of this evidence gathering process, as well as to a mix of businesses, commercial premises and locations in the community as part of our continuous monitoring of odour and evidence gathering process.
- Transwaste has appealed the abatement notice we issued in April. We continue to prepare for the court process which will hear this appeal.
- The Environment Agency issued a variation of permit notice to Transwaste in May. The notice specifies that the site can only accept inert waste going forward in a bid to reduce unwanted odour. We met with the EA team to hear the latest update on this matter and will continue to liaise with them as they monitor compliance.
- We noted a Health and Community Impact Report relating to Jameson Road Landfill Site published by the Director of Public Health for Lancashire.

Keep reporting unwanted odour

It is vital that residents continue to report incidents of unwanted odour and record how it affects them on diary sheets. This helps us to monitor whether people are still being impacted by unwanted odour or if the situation has improved.

We can only do this with your help...

Please follow these three steps:

1. Fill in an odour diary sheet

Please tell us:

- when the odour happened and how long it lasted
- where you noticed it
- how strong it was and how it affected you

2. Send your completed sheets to Wyre Council

3. Agree to an officer verification visit if we contact you

Where possible, the visit should take place where the odour affects you most.
